FEMA/GEMA Property Acquisition Projects require 15% local match. Project Kingsland West #4 is ready for pre-application submittal pending approval of local match. A combination of funding and in-kind labor is available in the current budget for the match. Total project cost is \$135,222. Funding is a combination of 75% Federal (\$101,416), 10% State (\$13,522), and 15% Local City Match (Cash \$4,556; In-Kind Labor \$15,728). Staff Recommends Approval.

4. Approval Of: Grant Matching Funds-Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) to Provide Funds for Drainage Mitigation Projects -

FEMA/GEMA grant funds are available to entities that were federally designated as disaster areas due to Hurricane Irma under section 404 of the Stafford Disaster and Emergency Assistance Act. The purpose of the HMGP program is to help communities implement hazard mitigation measures following a Presidential major disaster declaration. Hazard mitigation is any action taken to reduce or eliminate long term risk to people and property from natural hazards. Funds requested will be used for drainage mitigation projects for the proposed areas: Gross Road-South & North Crossing, May Creek-Scrubby Bluff, Grove Blvd, Kingsland West-Meadows & Woodhaven. A combination of funding and in-kind labor is available in the general fund and SPLOST budgets for the match. Total project cost is estimated at \$3,602,820. Funding is a combination of 75% Federal (\$2,702,115), 10% State (\$360,282), and 15% Local City Match (\$540,423). Staff Recommends Approval.

Funding is a combination of 75% Federal (\$414,750), 10% State (\$55,300), and 15% Local City Match (\$82,950). Staff Recommends Approval.

SERVICES CONTRACT

This Services Contract (this "Contract") made and entered into as of _____, 2018, by and between the **CITY OF KINGSLAND, acting by and through its Mayor and City Council (the "City")** and the **CAMDEN COMMUNITY CRISIS CENTER, INC.**, a non-profit corporation created pursuant to the laws of the State of Georgia (the "Center").

RECITALS

WHEREAS under the laws of the State of Georgia family violence between past or present spouses, persons who are parents of the same child, parent and children stepparents and stepchildren, for the parents and foster children, or other persons living or formerly living in the same household is a continuing problem;

WHEREAS the Police Department of the City of Kingsland is required to intervene in family violence situations to protect certain innocent person or persons from scenes of actual or potential violence;

WHEREAS as the Center provides a shelter for victims of family violence when the Police Department finds it necessary for the safety of the victim or potential victim to be removed from an unsafe environment.

WHEREAS the Center provides food, shelter, and clothing and other services for victims(s) of family violence;

WHEREAS the city desires to retain the services of the Center to provide a safe

shelter to residents of the City of Kingsland exposed to or a victim of family violence.

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the premises and the mutual covenants, promises and agreements herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Recitals.

The recitals herein before set forth are true.

2. Terms of Contract.

This Contract shall be for an initial period of one (1) year commencing on _____, 2018 and terminating on _____, 2018, unless sooner terminated in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement, or as extended by written agreement of the parties.

2. Payment.

The City shall pay to the Center for its services to victims of family violence the sum of SEVEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$ 7,500.00), per year, which shall be payable on the ____ day of _____ of each year , until this Contract is terminated.

3. Events of Default; Remedies.

The following occurrences shall constitute Events of Default hereunder:

- (a) Center fails to provide the services required of Center _____ a period time, in family violence situations;
- (b) Fails to assist the City Police in family violence occurrences;
- (c) Dissolution of the existence of the Center;
- (d) Any legal or equitable action is commenced against Center which, if adversely

determined, could reasonably be expected to impair substantially the ability of the Center to perform each and every obligation under this Contract; and

(e) Upon the occurrence of any Event of Default, the City may declare this Contract null and void without prior notice to the Center. All unearned city Funds shall be returned to the City.

5. General Conditions.

(a) No Waiver. No Waiver or any provision of this Contract shall waive any other provision of this Contract or preclude the City from declaring a default if the Center is unable to satisfy any such provisions or perform hereunder.

Notices. All notices hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been sufficiently given or served for all purposes when presented personally or sent by registered or certified mail to the other party hereto at the address set forth herein, with instruction to show to whom delivered and return receipt requested. Each party may notify the other by the same process of any change of such address. Loan requests and disbursements and other routine contract administration may be conducted by regular mail.

7. Remedies Cumulative: The remedies provided for the City herein shall not be exclusive but shall be concurrent, in addition to and cumulative of any other remedies the City may have by law. The failure to seek or exercise any remedy shall not be deemed a waiver or foreclose any subsequent remedy.
8. Assignment. This Contract may not be assigned by the Center without the advance written consent of the City.
9. Continuity. This Contract shall be binding upon the legal representative, successors and assigns of each party and shall inure to their benefit; provided, however, that nothing herein said shall be deemed to limit any restriction on assignment imposed upon the Center.
10. Georgia Contract. This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Georgia.
11. Counterparts. This Contract is executed in two counterparts, which are separately numbered, but each of which is deemed one and the same instrument as the other.
12. Time of Essence. Time is of the essence of this Contract.
13. Entire Agreement. This Contract contains the entire terms of this agreement and transaction. They may not be changed, waived or discharged in whole or in part, except by written instrument executed by the party sought to be charged therewith.

14. Severability. If any provision of this Contract, or any portion thereof, should be ruled void, invalid, unenforceable or contrary to public policy by any court of competent jurisdiction, any remaining provisions of this Contract shall survive and be applied, and together with the invalid or unenforceable portion shall be construed reformed to preserve as much of the original words, terms, purpose and intent as shall be permitted by law.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the **CAMDEN COMMUNITY CRISIS CENTER, INC AND THE CITY OF KINGSLAND** have caused these presents to be signed, sealed and delivered all as of the date hereof.

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE CAMDEN COUNTY
BOARD OF ELECTIONS AND REGISTRATION

WHEREAS, that in compliance with Official Code of Georgia Annotated § 21-2-45, the Camden County Board of Commissioners and the municipalities of St. Marys, Kingsland, and Woodbine, by and through their elected officials, are desirous of creating a Camden County Board of Elections and Registration, along with the express consent of Probate Judge Robert C. Sweatt, Jr.; and

WHEREAS it is necessary to provide for the powers and duties of the same; to provide for the composition of the board and the selection, qualification, and terms of its members; to provide for resignation, succession, and removal of members and for filling vacancies; to provide for oaths and privileges; to relieve certain boards and officers of certain powers and duties and provide for the transfer of certain items to the newly created board; to abolish a certain board and officers; to provide for meetings and procedures; to provide for the elections supervisor and the powers and duties of such elections supervisor; to provide for board employees and their compensation; to provide for expenditures of public funds for certain purposes; to provide for compensation of the members of the board of elections and registration; to provide for offices and equipment; to provide for contracts with certain municipalities; to provide for the meaning of certain terms; to provide for effective dates; and

WHEREAS, in order to achieve this objective, local legislation establishing the same must be passed by the Georgia General Assembly;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Camden County Board of Commissioners and the municipalities of St. Marys, Kingsland, and Woodbine, by and through their elected officials, hereby request the filing of local legislation to establish Camden County Board of Elections and Registration for consideration and approval in the 2018 Georgia General Assembly Legislative Session. Said Board shall be governed in accordance with the terms and conditions of the proposed legislation attached hereto as Exhibit A.

CE-Tech of Jacksonville, Inc. - Contract Terms and Conditions

WHEREAS: Client wishes to obtain and CE-Tech wishes to provide to Client equipment consultation, maintenance and repair services: NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree:

1.1 SERVICE: CE-Tech shall furnish Client, subject to the terms hereof and the specific device "SERVICE CODE" listed on the attached equipment inventory/quote contingent on all devices being in a fully operational status according to manufacturer's specifications at commencement of Agreement.

SERVICES MAY INCLUDE

ELECTRICAL SAFETY TESTING: This shall be electrical safety testing of patient care line-operated equipment in accordance with applicable federal and state regulatory agencies and Joint Commission, as set forth on the effective date hereof in the comprehensive electrical safety standards document that CE-Tech adheres to.

PERFORMANCE VERIFICATION/CALIBRATION (Scheduled Maintenance): This shall be a periodic check associated with electronic equipment wherein device functionality and operation is performed and verified.

PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE (Scheduled Maintenance): This shall be a periodic inspection associated with electronic equipment wherein recommended preventative maintenance procedures are followed and output is measured and as needed or possible, adjusted in accordance with SPECIFICATIONS established by the manufacturers of the equipment.

DOCUMENTATION: CE-Tech will provide Client with documentation which describes maintenance and repair services in sufficient detail as to meet appropriate accreditation and state standards/requirements.

REPAIR (Unscheduled Maintenance): This shall be unscheduled repairs of malfunctioning equipment and will be at the request of Client. Repairs will be accomplished by the most expedient method. CE-Tech will advise Client of necessary replacement parts and Client will be responsible for obtaining all replacement parts, except as noted.

IN-SERVICE EDUCATION: This shall be device operator training to client, clinical and engineering staff by CE-Tech on a Time & Materials basis at times mutually agreed upon. In-service education hours are provided to the extent described in paragraph 1.2.

EQUIPMENT SELECTION: This shall be consultation on device selection provided by CE-Tech staff on a Time & Materials basis. Comparative analysis – in accordance with criteria to be supplied by Client and mutually agreed upon – with respect to device design, performance, reliability, supportability and cost will be provided allowing Client to make optimal use of its resources in new equipment purchases. Equipment selection hours are provided to the extent described in paragraph 1.2.

EQUIPMENT ACCEPTANCE TESTING: This shall be an incoming inspection and performance verification for new equipment available upon request, which should be conducted prior to authorization for payment to the equipment vendor and use at the Client's facility.

1.2 SCHEDULING ARRANGEMENT: Except by alternative arrangements, SCHEDULED MAINTENANCE under paragraph 1.1A will be provided only during CE-Tech's NORMAL WORKING HOURS (8:00a.m. – 5:00p.m., Monday-Friday, excluding holidays). CE-Tech must provide Client with a statement describing an acceptable arrangement for notifying Client when equipment should be made available for servicing and CE-Tech's policy for rescheduling when equipment is not available at the time of the scheduled service call. Repair will be available during normal working hours. Telephone assistance for repair is available as soon as possible, typically within 2 hours of request. Telephone consultation will be provided with the CE-Tech technician, and on-site service will be scheduled as soon as possible. Emergency repairs that become necessary at times outside normal working hours will be charged separately, according to the rate schedule in paragraph 2.2, or will be referred to the original manufacturer.

1.3 PARTIAL CANCELLATION of Items Under Schedule A: CE-Tech or Client may, at its option and upon giving the other party 60 days written notice, cancel this Agreement as to any item on Schedule A which is subject to replacement in the judgment of a reasonable and prudent owner due to obsolescence or wear producing and inordinate rate of repair or equipment failure. Upon such partial termination, the compensation otherwise provided on page 1 and under paragraph 2.1 shall be reduced to the extent of the scheduled rate for the canceled item.

COMPENSATION

2.1 NORMAL WORKING CONDITIONS: All proposed costs are contingent on all devices being in a fully operational status according to manufacturer's specifications at commencement of Agreement.

2.2 OUTSIDE NORMAL WORKING HOURS: CE-Tech will provide emergency repairs at 1.5x the appropriate labor rate as indicated in CE-Tech's Rate Schedule. Client will also be charged for travel time at that rate. Sundays and holidays at 2x times the labor rate.

2.3 DEMAND LABOR: Demand repairs will be provided at the scheduled rate per device as outlined under CE-Tech's Rate Schedule including travel time. At least 30 days prior to the anniversary date of this Agreement, CE-Tech shall furnish client with information concerning fees and terms for services during the subsequent year.

2.4 ANNUAL CONTRACT: Annual contract costs shall be payable monthly in advance, unless prior arrangements have been made.

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

3.1 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, CE-Tech shall not be deemed to have breached this Agreement or to be in any way liable for damages on account of the failure to perform or the delay in performing its obligations hereunder caused by: strikes, lockouts or other industrial disturbances; acts of public enemies, regulations of any kind by government, State or any of their respective departments, agencies or officials, or of any civil, military, municipal or other governmental authority; insurrections; riots, acts of God; epidemics, landslides, lightning, earthquakes, fires, hurricanes, floods, washouts, restraint of government and people; civil disturbances; explosions, partial or entire failure of utilities; or any other cause or event not reasonably within the control of CE-Tech.

3.2 The parties agree that CE-Tech will be responsible for any damages to property or injuries to persons proximately caused by any negligent act or omission by an agent or employee of CE-Tech, but CE-Tech shall in no event be liable and Client shall hold CE-Tech, its agents or employees harmless from damages resulting from use or design of equipment subject to this Agreement.

COMPLIANCE WITH OMNIBUS RECONCILIATION ACT

4.1 CE-Tech will make available upon written request of the Secretary of Health and Human Services or the Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their duly authorized representatives, the contract and books, documents and records that are necessary to certify the nature and extent of costs associated with this Agreement during any year in which services are being provided and for a period of four years from completion of all services provided under this Agreement.

AGREEMENT BINDING

5.1 This Agreement is binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and upon their respective successors, legal representatives, and assigns.

RELATIONSHIP

6.1 The parties hereto agree that CE-Tech is an independent contractor and is not, and shall not be by virtue of this Agreement be deemed, an employee or agent of the Client.

6.2 The obligations of each of the parties hereunder shall inure to the exclusive benefit of the other party hereto and no third person shall have, or be desired to have, any rights hereunder as third party beneficiary or otherwise.

MANUFACTURER'S SPECIFICATIONS

7.1 The compensation provided under this contract to CE-Tech is subject to the covered equipment meeting manufacturer's specifications. If it is determined by CE-Tech after the execution of this Agreement that such equipment does not meet manufacturer's specifications, then CE-Tech will charge the Client, and the Client will pay CE-Tech an additional compensation (as indicated above), to bring such equipment to specifications.

SERVICE MANUALS

8.1 It is the Client's responsibility to provide CE-Tech all the service manuals and electrical safety necessary to maintain listed equipment.

TERM AND TERMINATION

9.1 This Agreement shall commence on ("Effective Date") as indicated on the front page and shall be in force for a period indicated from its Effective Date. This Agreement shall expire at the end of said period unless it is extended. This Agreement and all its terms and conditions may be extended from year to year, or for a term beyond its initial term, by a letter agreement to that effect executed by both parties at any time during the Agreement term.

INSURANCE

10.1 The Service Provider shall obtain general liability insurance coverage for the Service Provider with limits of liability of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence and at least \$3,000,000 per annum in the aggregate (or such greater coverage as may be required by applicable law), with such insurance carrier or carriers as the Hospital shall reasonably approve and shall maintain such insurance throughout the term of this Agreement. The Service Provider shall provide the Hospital with a certificate evidencing such insurance coverage, which certificate shall indicate that the hospital shall be notified at least fifteen (15) days prior to any termination, cancellation or modification of such coverage.
