V. PRESENTATION

1. FY2020 Audit Presentation - by Trey Scott, CPA of Mauldin & Jenkins, CPAs -
Mr. Trey Scott, CPA of Maulding & Jenkins, CPAS gave a presentation on the Fiscal Year 2020 audit. Mr. Scott noted that their audit had no findings and was reported as

clean. Mr. Scott also noted that the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2020 went above and beyond what is required.

VI. GRANTING AUDIENCE TO THE PUBLIC

Ms. Janie Everett, 115 S. Lee Street, Kingsland, GA with the Thikol Memorial Project spoke to Mayor and Council asking for help with projects that they are currently working on. Ms. Everett first asked Mayor and Council for their support by writing letters to the White House in order to have the thirty Fallen Patriots of Thikol awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Ms. Everett then asked for access of any city records from February 1971 through February 1972 for any measures the city may have taken in support of Thikol. Ms. Everett also stated that they are filming oral history segments for the museum and asked that any past Thiokol Plant workers, the family of the workers, first responders from the sixteen responding cities, hospital personnel, military and civilian rescue personnel, and members of the community to share their memories of the Woodbine Thiokol Chemical Plant and the 1971 Plant Explosion to contact the museum if they were interested in scheduling appointment.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS

1. Bid Award: Asphalt Resurfacing -

Request for proposals for asphalt resurfacing with striping using thermoplastic with reflective beads. Fourteen roads are included in this project and are funded by LMIG with 30% match requirement from SPLOST VIII. *Staff recommends low bid, Seaboard Construction, for a total cost of \$366,659.69.*

2. Bid Award: Roadway Rehab Including Mill, Leveling, and Overlay -

Request for proposal for roadway rehab to include mill, leveling, and overlay for Wildcat Drive, May Creek Drive, and Scrubby Bluff Road. Project is funded by SPLOST VIII. *Staff recommends low bid for each road as follows: Seaboard Construction for Wildcat Drive (\$133,798.00) and May Creek Drive (\$428,692.54) and East Coast Asphalt for Scrubby Bluff Road (\$357,726.40). Total cost of \$920,216.94.*

Councilman Blount asked Public Works Director Bill Coleman why the Maycreek Road projection was more than originally planned. Mr. Coleman stated that after core samples had been taken, it was decided that the best course of action was to repair the entire road and not just specific areas.

Councilman Galloway asked if the contracts included a timeline due to some of the roads having schools on them. Mr. Coleman stated that they would have deadlines.

Councilman Fullilove asked if the construction was still going on at the high school on Wildcat Drive and felt that if it was, we needed to wait on Wildcat Drive due to possible damage from construction equipment. Mayor Day stated that the heavy construction should be completed around June 17, 2021.
