Ms. Martin showed satellite pictures of the lake from 2017, 2021 and 2024 showing how the lake is changing due to the drainage issue coming in from Millers Brank Creek. Ms. Martin asked why if the lake is private property is it being used for drainage by the city. She also stated they are having the water tested for pollutants.
